

# Reading Questions

## Tips

- Asking questions during your child's at home reading time will strengthen their comprehension skills.
- Practice is what will make the biggest difference so be sure to set a goal of reading with your child every single night.
- During your nightly reading ask your child 2-3 questions about the text you are reading together.
- Have your child write their answers down once a week to build on an answering method they use in school.
- Make your reading time enjoyable! This time should be pressure free and a time for you and your child to have fun exploring new books!

## Before the Story

- What do you think this story is about?
- What made you pick this story?
- What do you think you will learn about when you read this book?
- Who will this book be about?
- Why are you excited to read this book?

## During the Story

- Who is your favorite character right now?
- What do you think will happen next?
- How do you think the character is feeling right now?
- What would you do if that happened to you?
- Have you learned anything new so far?

# Reading Questions

## After the Story

- What was your favorite part of the book?
- What was the big problem that happened in the story?
- How did the characters solve the problem?
- Did you like the book? Why or why not?
- Would you want to be friends with the main character?
- Did you learn anything new from this book?
- How would you describe this character?
- Where did this story take place?
- How did the story end?
- Ask any specific question in relation to the story i.e.
  - Who was their brother?
  - What was he mad about?
  - Why didn't she want to play?

## Summarize

- What happened in the beginning?
- What happened in the middle?
- How did the story end?
- How would you explain this story to a friend?
- What was the problem in the story and how was it solved?
